**Scout Behavior**

Scouts are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the Scout Oath and Law. A first incident of improper behavior will result in a Scout calling home. Any further incidents will result in a scout being suspended from the event, and the scout's parent(s)/guardian will be called to come and pick their scout up from the event. Examples of unacceptable behavior include, but are not limited to, disrespect for authority and insubordination of youth leaders, or adult advisors, actions that endanger the physical well-being of others, physical or sexual abuse, mental abuse, profanity, dishonesty, antagonism or harsh criticism of others, any unlawful behavior, and failure to adhere to Troop policies and procedure.
